COACHES:

Remember that junior players participate for pleasure and winning is only part of the fun;

Never ridicule or yell at a junior player for making a mistake or not winning.

Be reasonable in your demands;

Operate within the rules and spirit of the game and teach your players to do the same;

Avoid overplaying the talented players—the just average need and deserve equal time; Ensure safety is maintained, taking into account age and ability of all players;

Display control, respect and professionalism to all involved with the sports. Encourage your players to do the same;

Show concern and caution toward sick and injured players;

Obtain appropriate qualifications and keep up to date with latest coaching practices;

Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

SPECTATORS:

Remember that young people participate for their enjoyment and benefit, not yours;

Applaud good performance and efforts from all individuals and teams;

Respect decisions of officials and teach junior players to do the same;

Never ridicule or scold a player for making a mistake. Positive comments are motivational;

Condemn the use of violence in any form, whether it is by spectators, coaches, officials or players;

Show respect for your team's opponents. Without them there would be no game;

Encourage players to follow the rules and officials' decisions;

Do not use foul language, sledge or harass players, coaches or officials;

Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion

PARENTS:

Remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment;

Encourage children to participate, do not force them;

Encourage children always to play according to the rules and to settle disagreements without resorting to hostility or violence;

Remember that children learn best by example. Appreciate good performances and skilful plays by all participants;

Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from all of soccer's activities;

Respect official's decisions and teach children to do the same;

Show appreciation for volunteer coaches, officials and administrators. Without them, your child could not participate;

Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

PLAYERS:

Play by the rules;

Never argue with a referee or assistant referee. If you disagree, have your captain, coach or manager approach the official on your behalf;

Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials and sledging other players, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviours in soccer;

Work equally hard for yourself and your team.

Be a good sport, recognize all good plays whether they are part of your team or the opposition;

Treat all participants in soccer as you like to be treated. Do not bully or take unfair advantage of other competitors;

Cooperate with your coach, teammates and opponents. Without them there would be no game;

Participate for your own enjoyment

and benefit, not just to please parents and coaches;

Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
